## **Imam's Corner**

Assalamu Alaikom Wa Rahmatu Allahe Wa Barakatuh,

Dear Parents/caregivers,

The Qur'an is the biggest ni'ma (blessing) that Allah has given us. Every Prophet, peace be upon them all, was given a miracle that was enough for his people to follow him. Musa peace be upon him, had a stick that turned into a snake. And our Prophet Peace and blessings be upon him, told us that what he was given was not a physical miracle, it was the Qur'an. The Qur'an is not time-bound. It proves the message by the content of the message.











The Quran is an accessible book. Every book is structured with an audience in mind. A primary school book is not written the same as an academic book. The Qur'an is a book that addresses everyone. The Quran has always been at the centre of the Ummah. Allah tells us, "We have made the Qur'an easy for remembering. Is there anyone who wishes to remember?

The scholars of Tajweed are particular about every sound of the Qur'an and how it is pronounced. They wouldn't be particular in the same way about spoken Arabic, but this isn't just spoken Arabic, it is Qur'anic Arabic. It's not dialectical variation. The scholars even discuss the validity of the prayer for someone who makes a mistake in recitation.







On the 15th and 16th of November 2023/1445, the Australian Islamic College held its Annual Quran and Azan Competition at the Adelaide campus. Alhamdulillah the Quran competition was a great success with 73 participants ranging from Reception to Year 12. The main aim for the Quran competition was to encourage students to recite The Holy Quran and to provide them with the opportunity to compete with each other with the best recitation of the words of Allah. # **Literacy Coordinator – Primary School**

Assalamu Alaikum Dear Parents and Caregivers

We have had a busy and productive year in Primary Literacy. This term we have completed our PAT tests. These tests are completed each year and are used to identify student needs, target teaching and monitor learning growth. Over 5000 Australian schools use PAT Progressive Achievement. PAT tests allow teachers to collect evidence of student learning; to identify where students are in their learning at a given point in time; to monitor growth over time and to reflect on student attainment. Our students have also completed a writing assessment called E-Write. The results from this, have shown a remarkable improvement since the implementation of a writing program Seven Steps.

We have continued to regularly test our students reading progress and have introduced a home online reading program through Literacy Pro. We would like to thank all our teachers for their time and effort needed to plan, implement and teach every child according to their individual needs and thank our parents who continued to support their child with listening to reading at home and preparing for their weekly spelling tests. Your child's access to the home reading program will be available in the holidays and we strongly encourage them to keep up with their reading. This program also has an extensive collection of non-fiction books so please choose a variety of topics to not only increase your reading skills but to also increase your general knowledge. This program can be accessed from our schools Home page, student portal and their Lexile username and password.

Looking forward - we have begun setting up and reading and borrowing program for our Kindy Students.

The Early Years Learning Framework (EYLF) defines literacy as 'the capacity, confidence and disposition to use language in all its forms'. This can includes talking, listening, viewing, reading, writing and, storytelling. Our students already are involved in many reading experiences at school and this will now include books going home. Research shows that reading improves comprehension: the more students read voluntarily, the greater their achievement levels. The pre-school and early primary school environment and culture (school and at home) should enable and encourage reading.

In 2024, we will continue to foster key pedagogic principals for effective teaching of Mathematics to develop our students critical thinking skills and promoting fluency and transfer of learnt skills.

Every Tuesday and Thursday	Further offer rounds emailed Tuesdays and Thursdays until 14 March 2024.
14 March 2024	Last offer round for Semester 1 offers. Offers will be emailed by 5pm.

As you are all aware our big achievement for this term was the graduation ceremony. It is unbelievable how time has flown, and the end of the year is on our doorstep. It has been exciting and tiring term simultaneously.

Students have enjoyed their transition visits and have already familiarised themselves with the teachers and classroom environment. It made the students feel proud and motivated them to work harder, especially with the fine motor skills and meeting teachers' expectations, Mashallah!

## Year 1

As we approach the end of an incredible academic year, we are thrilled to reflect on the outstanding achievements and growth in Year 1. The dedication of our students and the unwavering support from our parents have truly made this year exceptional.

#### Math

In maths, we embarked on our final learning modules for 2023. We investigated, addition and subtraction patterns, adding coins to match a total, solving money problems, calculating change, estimating answers within 100.

## **English**

This term the students have been focussing on the narrative and report writing genres using the Seven Steps Program. The students independently produced amazing and interesting narratives following the structure learned in Term 3. It was wonderful to see the students engaged when learning about information reports and they used a range of sources to create their own reports using the report writing structure. The students have continued with the Jolly Grammar program, completing weekly grammar lessons as well as spelling tests.

#### Health

This term in Health, students learnt about how to take care of themselves when in the sun and in the water. We also learnt about the organs of the human body. Students enjoyed participating in activities such as making posters, having class discussions, watching videos, and completing word searches.

#### Art

For Art this term, the focus has been on creating Aboriginal artworks. Students enjoyed painting sea turtles on stones using nature colours and the Aboriginal dot painting technique. Students also enjoyed designing their own boomerangs by incorporating Aboriginal symbols using nature colours. Finally, students received a template of an Australian animal, and they designed it using Aboriginal symbols, nature colours and the Aboriginal dot painting technique. Throughout these tasks, students were able to use a variety of different materials.

#### PE

PE this term was about practising different cricket skills such as throwing, catching, and batting. Student enjoyed participating in partner and small group activities in order to perfect these skills.

## **Technologies**

For Digital Technologies this term, students continued to learn about coding and algorithms. They enjoyed designing their own mazes using different directions to solve them. Some students created very challenging mazes which were exciting to solve. 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## Year 4

This term has been a vibrant journey focusing on the 'golden rule' – the power of words and the significance of treating others with kindness and respect. Students have been immersed in the understanding that words possess immense power and have worked diligently to use language that uplifts and supports others, steering away from hurtful remarks.

In Mathematics, our students have explored a diverse range of concepts and skills. They've delved into comparing the areas of regular and irregular shapes, interpreting information on basic maps using scales and directions, creating symmetrical patterns both digitally and manually, and mastering the comparison and classification of angles. Moreover, they've skilfully constructed data displays to represent and analyse collected data, employing tables, column graphs, and picture graphs.


